Contacto en Medios

- SS: 2150 analyzed samples, 802 tested positive for virus A/H1N1, 26 have died
- States without confirmed cases of A/H1N1 influenza: Coahuila, Nuevo León, Campeche, Sinaloa, Baja California Sur and Nayarit.
- WHO: 1085 influenza cases in 21 nations.
- The 31 governors, the head of government of the Federal District and the Executive decided that senior highschool and university students will return to classes Thursday 7th, elementary students Monday 11th.
- Economic and educational activities will gradually start beginning Wednesday 6th.
- The President announced a reactivation plan which includes incentives for tourism and fiscal stimuli, as well as a world-wide campaign to promote tourism.
 - Companies will be allowed to compensate income taxes (ISR) with its monthly payments of the Enterprise Fixed Tax (IETU). The taxes paid by cruise tourists will be “temporarily” reduced.
 - The Secretariat of Labor carried out 2,507 inspection in work centers all over the country, from May 1st to 3rd, 1,206 (48,2%) did not close activities, so they will be sanctioned with fines between 17,262 and 328,800 pesos (clothes, stationery, furniture, shoe, department, mattress and video stores, as well as gambling establishments)
- CANIRAC: the restaurant industry received the worst blow, it lost 1.2 billion pesos.
- In response to “the unjustified” isolation and discrimination that Mexicans have experienced in China, Mexico’s Foreign Affairs Secretariat (SRE) sent an airplane yesterday to repatriate those who desire to come back.
- Mexico asked the UN to stop xenophobia actions resulting from the influenza scare, because they lack scientific justification and they violate human rights.
